FREE SAMPLE DISTRIBUTION TO PATIENTS:

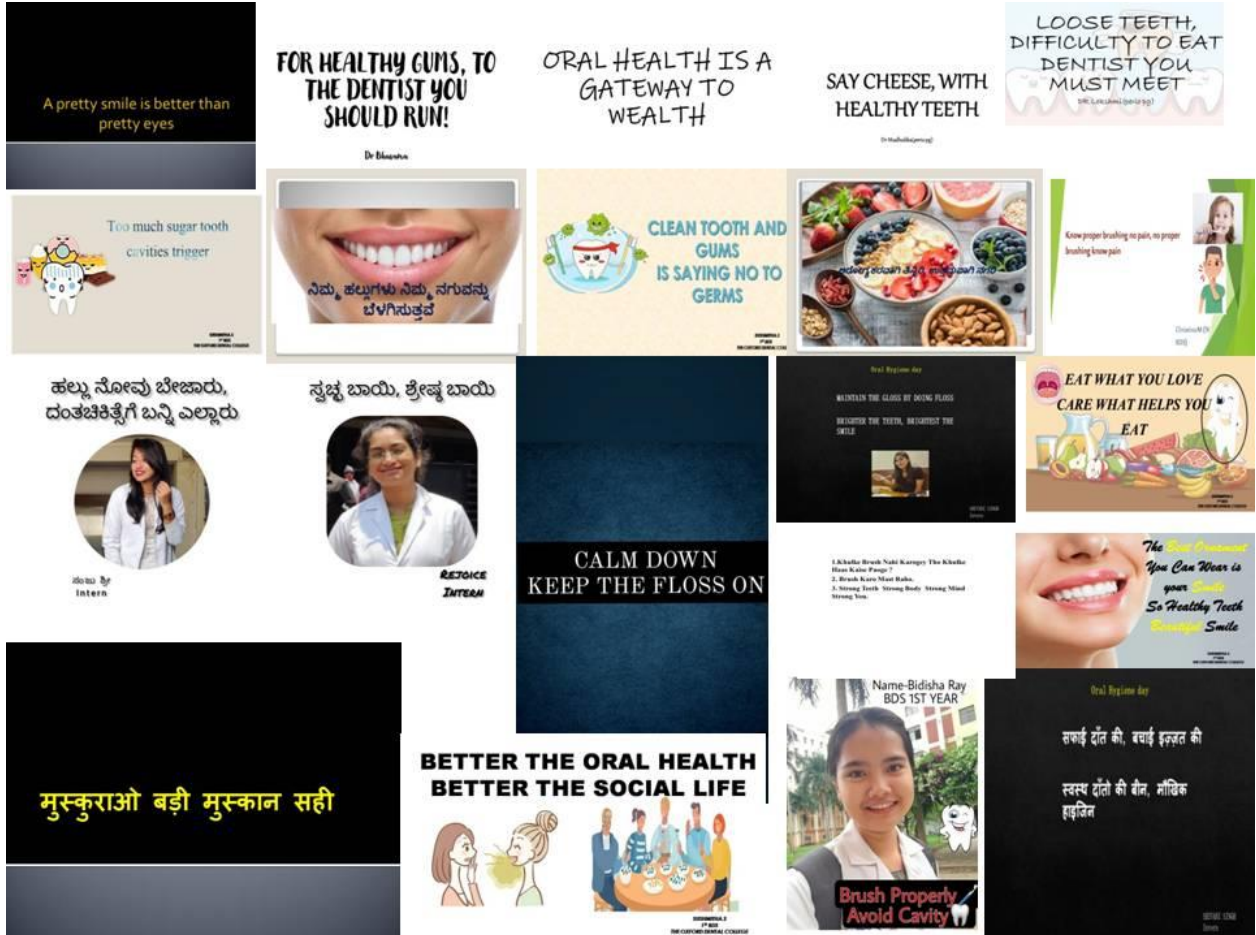
During the course of the Oral Hygiene Week, all patients were given oral hygiene instructions and provided with free toothpaste samples.



SLOGAN COMPETITION:

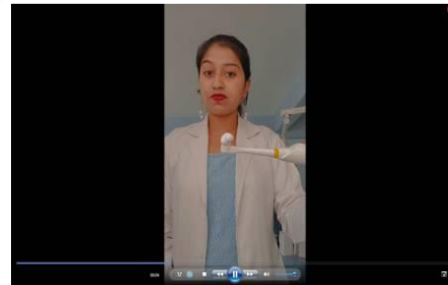
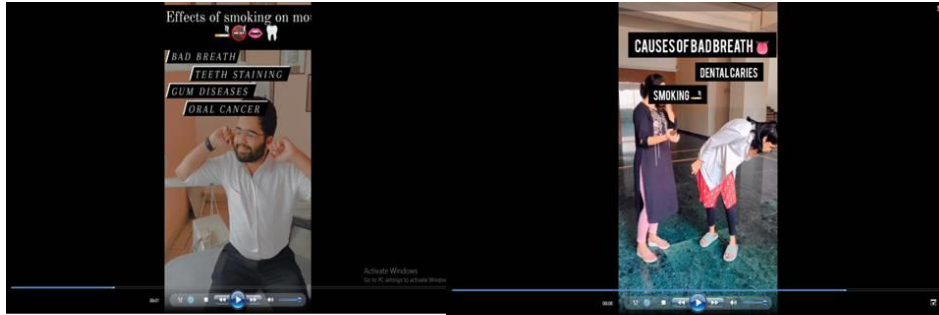

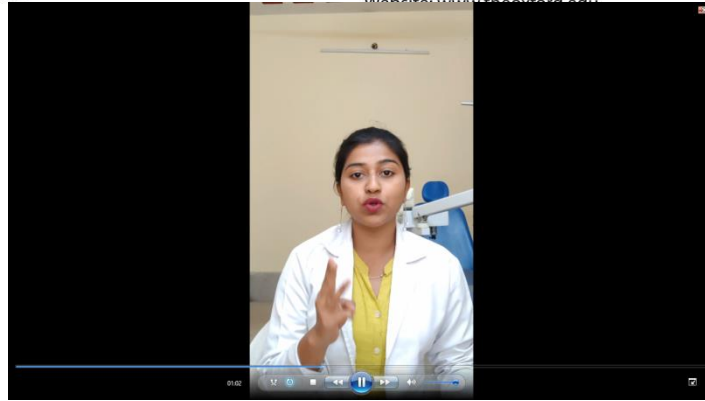
REELS:
