Dental College provides annual calendar to all the students which comprises of the time-table for the 3rd year, parent teacher meetings and all other important details pertaining to the university examinations and internal evaluations. The entire process which is followed systematically allows us to prepare the students thoroughly for the examinations. This is definitely reflecting in the performance of the students. The RGUHS university has a controller of examinations and postgraduation who controls the conduct of examination. The university appoints an in-house controller at the center throughout the course of theory examination. In addition, a flying squad appointed by RGUHS visits to monitor the overall process and transparency in the conduct of exams. The examination halls are equipped with cameras for the online surveillance undertaken by the RGUHS university for the continuous monitoring of the overall evaluation of the answer papers undertaken by the RGUHS university in the respective centers allow for the timely release of university results and maintains transparency in the process of evaluation.
